Anti-Bullying Week

Dear Parents and Carers,

Anti-bullying week 2025 will take place from Monday 10th – Friday 14th November, with the theme: **Power for Good**.

- This Anti-Bullying week, we're empowering children to use their **Power for Good** to safely speak up and raise awareness when they see bullying, face to face or online.
- Together, we can use our Power for Good to end bullying- for good

The week will begin with **Odd Socks Day** on **Monday 10**th, with adults and children being encouraged to wear odd socks to celebrate what makes us unique.

At Canon Popham, all staff are trained to know and understand bullying can happen anywhere: in the classroom, corridors and playground, or outside of school – both online and offline. Some pupils can face prejudice-based or discriminatory bullying, based on perceived differences.

Throughout the school year, but especially during next week, our children are given reminders of what bullying is. We do this by using this clear message:

What is bullying?

A bully is someone who **hurts** another person **more than once**, by using behaviour which is meant to **scare**, **hurt** or **upset** that person.

We can use the word 'STOP' to identify bullying:

Several

Times

On

Purpose

It is important to remember that **single problems** and **falling out with friends** are not **bullying**. Bullying is behaviour which is **repeated** on purpose and is meant to **upset** someone.
