Year 4 - Autumn 1

By the end of this half term, children should know the following facts. The aim is for them to know these facts **instantly**.

I know my number bonds to 100

Top Tips

- The secret to success is practising little and often. Use time wisely.
- You don't need to practise them all at once: perhaps you could have a fact of the day. If you would like more ideas, please speak to your child's teacher.
- Buy one get three free-If your child knows one fact (e.g. 8+ 5 = 13), can they tell you the other three facts in the same fact family?
- Use number bonds to 10 How can number bonds to 10 help you work out number bonds to 100?

Key Instant Recall Facts

Year 4 - Autumn 2

By the end of this half term, children should know the following facts. The aim is for them to know these facts **instantly**.

I know the multiplication and division facts for the six times table.

6 x 1 = 6	6 ÷ 6 = 1
6 x 2 = 12	12 ÷ 6 = 2
6 x 3 = 18	18 ÷ 6 = 3
6 x 4 = 24	24 ÷ 6 = 4
6 x 5 = 30	30 ÷ 6 = 5
6 x 6 = 36	36 ÷ 6 = 6
6 x 7 = 42	42 ÷ 6 = 7
6 x 8 = 48	48 ÷ 6 = 8
6 x 9 = 54	54 ÷ 6 = 9
6 × 10 = 60	60 ÷ 6 = 10
6 × 11 = 66	66 ÷ 6 = 11
6 x 12 = 72	72 ÷ 6 = 12

What is 8 multiplied by 6?

What is 6 times 9?

What is the **product** of 6 and 7?

What is 24 divided by 6?

Top Tips

- Songs and Chants-You can buy Times Tables CDs or find multiplication songs and chants online. If your child creates their own song, this can make the times tables even more memorable.
- Double your fours -Multiplying a number by 6 is the same as multiplying by 3 and then doubling the answer. 3×8 = 24 and double 24 is 48, so 6 ×8 = 48.
- Buy one get three free If your child knows one fact (e.g. 4×6 = 24), can they tell you the other three facts in the same fact family?
